Timetable

On Friday, matches start at 5pm and end no later than 10pm. On Saturday and Sunday, matches will start at 9.30am and 10am. One hour before the games start, the basketball halls will be open and the basketball committee will be present. Matches on Saturday will end no later than 8pm and on Sunday no later than 4pm. On Saturday and Sunday, each team can have lunch between 12 and 2pm (facilitated by the GNSK organisation).

The awards ceremony of the basketball tournaments will take place on Sunday around 4pm in Hall 1 of the Erasmus Sports Building. The award ceremony of the city ranking will take place on Sunday around 5pm in the Sports Café at the Erasmus Sports Building.

Match schedules

The match schedules can be found in the GNSK 2024 app in the section match schedules. Instructions and explanations about the app can be found below.

In the men's tournament, games will be played in two groups: 1 group of 7 teams and 1 group of 6 teams. The top two in each group will advance to the semi-finals on Sunday. The final matches will then be played for the gold and bronze medals. The numbers 3 and 4 per group will advance to the final round of places 5 to 8 on Sunday. Matches for the 9th place and 11th place will also be played on Sunday.

In the women's tournament, games will be played in two groups of 5 teams. The top two in each group will advance to the semi-finals on Sunday. The final matches are then played for the gold and bronze medals. The numbers 3 and 4 per group will advance to the final round of places 5 to 8 on Sunday. The competition for the 9th spot will also be played on Sunday.

Basketball related issues

It is important to read through the regulations (*see at the very end of this playbook*) for all participants and team officials.

Herewith some rules highlighted for the basketball tournament:

- Games are played using FIBA Basketball rules.
- A match lasts 25 minutes of continuous playing time with no change of court and no break, the last 3 minutes being pure playing time. The final is 2 times 15 minutes of pure playing time with 5 minutes break in between.

- Teams are expected to act as match tables if indicated on the match schedule with the match officials. These will keep score, (team) errors made and time. This will require 2 people.
- Games will be played without shotclock.
- In case of personal fouls, these are the main consequences:
 - Foul against a non-shooting player: ball possession;
 - Foul against a non-scoring shooting player: 1 point and ball possession;
 - Foul against a shooting player who scores: score + 1 point bonus;
 - Technical foul: 1 point and possession of the ball.
- No free throws will be taken.

Qualification European Universities Championships

The winners of the GNSK 2024 Basketball tournament will qualify for the 2025 European Universities Championships (EUC). These will be organised from 6 to 13 July in Bologna, Italy.

Competition venue

Basketball is played at the Erasmus Sports Building in hall 1 and hall 3. The address is: Burgemeester Oudlaan 50, 3062 PA Rotterdam.

Before sports can be played at the competition venue, registration is required at the registration desk in the Erasmus Sports Building (see below for more information).

Hall 1 can be found on the ground floor of the Erasmus Sports Building. Hall 3 can be found on the 4th floor and can be reached by stairs or lift. The match schedule shows in which hall each match is played. Court 1 and Court 2 are in hall 1. Court 3 and Court 4 are in hall 3.

All changing rooms are shared with other athletes. Please keep in mind that no valuables are left unattended. Erasmus Sport is not responsible for any theft. We expect consideration for each other and other athletes. There are enough free lockers available on the ground floor, so make sure to use these.

Hall 1

Hall 1 is accessed via the walkway that is over the reception hall. Walk through the gates next to the front desk, take 1 staircase up and then walk across the walkway to Hall 1. The changing rooms at Hall 1 are not located near the hall itself. To reach the changing rooms, walk through the gates straight ahead. This is where the men's changing rooms are located. Hall 1 will be for the men's competition. These changing rooms will be shared with the other sports.

Any spectators can get into the stands in front of Hall 1 by walking up the stairs that are on the right, immediately after you walk in through the sliding doors.

Hall 3

Hall 3 is accessible via the lift and stairs. This is also where changing rooms are located. Hall 3 will be for the ladies' competition. These changing rooms will be shared with the other sports. There are also toilets and taps on this floor. Any spectators can sit in the middle of the fields.

Basketball committee

The basketball committee is present on the stand in Hall 1. It can be reached by taking the stairs at the sliding doors of the main entrance immediately up the right-hand side. Here you walk through a door and basketball players can get additional info here. A committee member will be present in Hall 3 for help with any details.

Registration GNSK 2024

Signing up and registering for the GNSK 2024 must be done before participating in the sports tournament. This can be done on Friday and Saturday at the registration desk in the Erasmus Sports Building. The address is: Burgemeester Oudlaan 50, 3062 PA Rotterdam.

You can sign in at the following times:

- Friday 7 June: 3pm to 8pm
- Saturday 8 June: 8am to 1pm

You must be able to provide the following documents before applying:

- Valid certificate of registration from the educational institution, or certificate of graduation after 1 January 2023 (*only required for participants, not for team officials*)
- Valid accreditation card on the GNSK 2024 app (*see below GNSK 2024 app*)
- Valid passport, ID card or driving licence

After this is done, participants and team officials can go to the competition venue with a valid accreditation.

Transport to Erasmus Sports Building

At the Erasmus Sports Building several sports tournaments will be organised, breakfast, lunch and dinner will be served and all participants and team officials should sign in and register here. The address is: Burgemeester Oudlaan 50, 3062 PA Rotterdam.

Public transport

Erasmus Sport is very easy to reach by bicycle or public transport. If you come to Rotterdam by train, there are 3 ways to get to Erasmus Sport from Rotterdam Central Station:

- Public transport bike rental at Central Station
- Metro to stop Kralingse Zoom (take line D towards De Akkers or line E towards Slinge and change at stop Beurs to line A towards Binnenhof, line B towards Nesselande or line C towards De Terp)
- Tram to Burgemeester Oudlaan stop (line 7 towards Woudestein) or Oude Plantage stop (line 21 or 24 towards De Esch)

Car

If you come by car, you can park in the Erasmus University car park. Exit 7 is the quickest way to the Erasmus Sports Building.

An exit ticket for the car park costs €5 and can be obtained from the Erasmus Sports service desk. The exit ticket entitles you to a single exit and is therefore independent of how long you have parked. Without an exit ticket, parking is free for up to 19 minutes, after that the parking fee is €1.50 per hour and must be paid at the ticket machine before you can exit.

GNSK 2024 app

Once again this year there is the GNSK app containing all information about the GNSK, such as first aid, party and competition programmes. Importantly, the app is used for accreditation during the

GNSK and every participant and team official must download this app. In the following steps, you can download the app and request your personal accreditation:

Catering

All meals at the GNSK 2024 are vegetarian.

Breakfast

Breakfast on Saturday and Sunday mornings is open only to participants, team officials and volunteers who use the campsite with breakfast. The breakfast buffet will be facilitated in the Hatta building (opposite the Erasmus Sports Building). Everyone can walk past the breakfast buffet a maximum of 1 time and everyone should clean up his/her leftovers and waste neatly. Breakfast lasts from 7 to 9 am and shifts will be announced during the weekend.

Breakfast consists of bread with toppings (butter, hummus, cheese, chocolate spread, peanut butter) and fruit.

Lunch

Lunch will be provided on Saturday and Sunday afternoons for all participants, team officials and volunteers participating and/or operating on this day. Between 12 and 2pm, there will be the opportunity to collect lunch per team in the Hatta building (opposite the Erasmus Sports Building). The competition programme will continue during lunch, so participants must take this into account themselves in terms of planning.

Lunch consists of bread with toppings (butter, hummus, cheese, chocolate spread, peanut butter) and fruit.

Dinner

Dinner on Friday and Saturday is open only to participants and team officials who have purchased it when registering. Dinner will be served in the Erasmus Sport Café and can then be eaten in the Hatta Building (opposite the Erasmus Sports Building). Everyone can walk past the buffet 1 time and should clean up his/her leftovers and waste neatly. Dinner lasts from 5pm to 8pm and shifts will be announced during the weekend.

The meal on Friday consists of veggie sausage with jacket potatoes, eggplant, paprika, courgette, onion and chickpeas, complemented by a delicious fresh salad with cucumber and tomato.

The meal on Saturday consists of well-filled spaghetti with eggplant, courgette, onion, paprika, broccoli, leek and tomato.

Campsite

The campsite is at the Rotterdam Student Football Association Antibarbari, a stone's throw from Erasmus Sport. The address is: Kralingse Zoom 100, 3063 NC Rotterdam.

There is only use of the campsite if this is indicated when registering for GNSK 2024. Participants who have done so will spend the night on a grassy field and should bring their own tent and sleeping gear for this purpose. It is important to bring a tent suitable for the number of people who will sleep in it. If you bring a tent that is too big for the number of people that will sleep in it, the organisation may refuse the tent.

When you arrive at the campsite for the first time, you will have to report to the volunteers at the entrance and show your accreditation in the GNSK app. You can do this on Friday between 2pm and midnight and on Saturday between 8am and 8pm. The volunteers will assign you a spot, so if you want to camp together, make sure you arrive at the same time.

Every next time you want to enter the campside, you will have to show your accreditation in the GNSK app to security. So make sure your phone is charged!

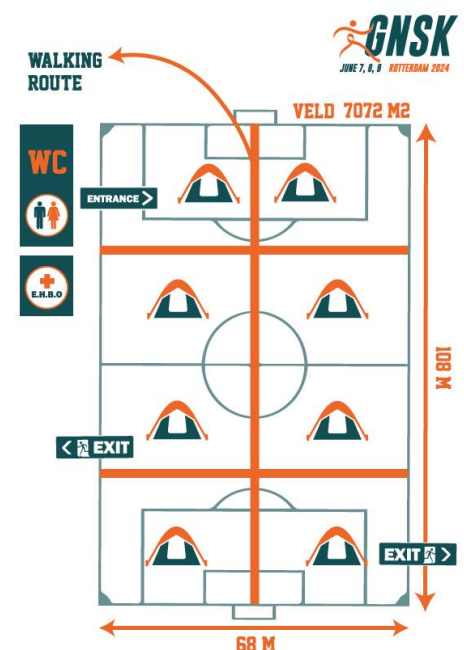
The campsite has toilets, drinking water and about 10 power points. So bring an extra battery or power bank to charge your phone overnight. Participants can shower at the sports venue of their sport.

Public transport

Tram to Nesserdijk stop (line 21 or 24 towards De Esch) or metro to Kralingse Zoom stop (line A, B or C + 10-minute walk).

Car

You can park your car temporarily (maximum 10 minutes) at the campsite for loading and unloading. To do so, use entrance RHV Leonidas (address: Toepad 95). After loading and unloading, you can park your car at Erasmus University (see above).



Opening ceremony

The opening ceremony starts on Friday 7 June at 7pm at the Erasmus Sports Building. All GNSK participants are welcome to attend. The programme is as follows:

- Start of the opening ceremony at 7pm
- Official opening at 7.30pm, including the OSSO award ceremony and the opening of the obstacle run
- Drinks from 20.00 to 22.00, with the opportunity to watch the beach volleyball matches and challenge the obstacle run

Party

This year's party will take place on Saturday 8th of June at the student association RSC/RVSV. The address is: Robert Baeldestraat 55, 3061 TH Rotterdam.

Participants, team officials, volunteers, supporters and other party enthusiasts can only gain access to the party if a ticket has been purchased in advance. This may have been done when registering for the GNSK 2024, or later via the Erasmus Sport webshop (see below for more information). There will be no ticket sales at the door.

From 20.00 you are welcome to join us for sparkling music, tasty drinks and a spacious dance floor to show off your moves. The music will be turned off at 01.00 and the last students will have to leave the party venue at 01.30 at the latest.

A ticket costs €10, with which you will receive a free drink (beer, wine or soft drink). The venue is easy to reach by bike and, if necessary, on foot.

Protest Committee

During the tournament, a protest may be submitted to the protest committee of the GNSK organisation by the team captain (in the case of a team tournament) or by an individual participant (in the case of an individual tournament). The protest must be submitted within 1 hour after the end of the match.

Team captains or participants may file a protest against other participants/teams based on the participation right and competition rules. Decisions of referees or other officials cannot be challenged, nor can the rules of the GNSK, the rules of the campsite and other articles of the event regulations of Student Sport Netherlands.

To file a protest, the following steps must be fulfilled:

- The chairman of the sports committee must be informed of the protest as soon as possible after the end of the match in which the alleged offence took place.
- The protest must be sent in by e-mail to info@studentensport.nl. The mail must be complete and sent within one hour of the end of the match.
- The protest must be signed by an official representative of the team and must contain the following elements:
 - Date, time and location of the incident
 - The relevant article that has been breached
 - A description of the situation
 - The name(s) of the protesting team/participants, signed

On Saturday, protests will be dealt with no later than the end of the day. On Sunday, protests will be dealt with as soon as possible, but no later than two hours after the protest is submitted. All protests must be settled before the start of the finals.

Match regulations (NL and EN)

Wedstrijdreglement Basketbal

GNSK 2024

Teamsamenstelling en speelgerechtigdheid

1. Per Overkoepelende Studenten Sport Organisatie (OSSO)/stad kunnen maximaal twee heren- en damesteams ingeschreven worden. Een team bestaat uit minimaal 5 en maximaal 12 spelers. Het eerste ingeschreven team per OSSO/stad heeft altijd recht om mee te doen. Afhankelijk van het aantal ingeschreven teams wordt besloten of het tweede team mee kan doen. Mochten er te veel tweede teams zijn voor de overgebleven plekken, gaat deelname op basis van volgorde van inschrijving.

2. De ingeschreven deelnemers van een OSSO/stad mogen uitsluitend bestaan uit studenten die voldoen aan de voorwaarden als gesteld in hoofdstuk 1 van het evenementenreglement van SSN. Bij overtreding van deze regel verliest het team alle wedstrijden. Als er een ongerechtigde deelnemer meedoet aan het GNSK, wordt er een boete van €200,- in rekening gebracht bij de OSSO/vertegenwoordigende organisatie in de stad voor welke die deelnemer uitkomt.

3. De teamopgave dient voor aanvang van iedere wedstrijd doorgegeven te worden aan de basketbalcommissie. Mocht een OSSO/stad twee deelnemende teams sturen, dan mogen er geen spelers gewisseld worden of bij het andere team meespelen. Mocht dit wel gebeuren, dan geldt artikel 2.

4. De winnaar van het basketbaltoernooi van het GNSK 2024 kwalificeert zich voor de European Universities Championships (EUC) van 6 t/m 13 juli 2025 in Bologna (Italië).

Wedstrijdbepalingen

5. De voorrondes bestaan uit poules. De poule-indeling geschiedt op basis van loting, waarbij teams geplaatst worden volgens de Uitvoeringsregeling Plaatsing GNSK 2024 en indien mogelijk teams van eenzelfde OSSO/stad worden verdeeld over verschillende poules. De basketbalcommissie beslist voor de loting hoeveel teams per poule zich kwalificeren voor het finaleschema dat door middel van een knock-outsysteem wordt gespeeld.
6. Bij een gewonnen wedstrijd krijgt een team 2 punten, bij een gelijkspel 1. De eindstand van de poule wordt bepaald op basis van het aantal punten dat een team behaald heeft. Bij een gelijke stand in een poulefase beslist achtereenvolgens het onderlinge resultaat en het puntensaldo. Als er nog geen beslissing is bereikt, nemen per team vijf verschillende spelers ieder één vrije worp. Indien nodig nemen hierna beide teams om beurten een vrije worp totdat er een beslissing is gevallen.
7. De duur van een wedstrijd is bepaald op 25 minuten doorlopende speeltijd zonder wissel van speelhelpt en zonder pauze, waarbij de laatste 3 minuten zuivere speeltijd is. De finale bestaat uit twee maal 15 minuten zuivere speeltijd, waarbij er een rust is tussen de helften van 5 minuten.
8. Per wedstrijd is 1 keer een time-out toegestaan per team van maximaal 1 minuut, waarbij de speeltijd gewoon doorloopt. Valt deze time-out in de zuivere speeltijd (tijdens de laatste drie minuten van een wedstrijd of tijdens de gehele finale), dan stopt de tijd wel.
9. De spelers mogen onbeperkt gewisseld worden, maar alleen tijdens een dood spelmoment (na fluitsignaal scheidsrechter).
10. In een poulefase is gelijkspel mogelijk. Eindigt in het verdere toernooi een wedstrijd gelijk, dan zal er met 5 minuten zuivere speeltijd verlengd worden. Indien er dan nog geen winnaar is, nemen per team vijf verschillende spelers ieder één vrije worp. Indien nodig nemen hierna beide teams om beurten een vrije worp totdat er een beslissing is gevallen.
11. De teams dienen op het in het wedstrijdschema aangegeven tijdstip aanwezig en speelklaar te zijn. Indien het team niet aanwezig is op het opgegeven tijdstip, dan verliest het team de wedstrijd. De uitslag is dan 20-0 in het voordeel van het aanwezige team.
12. Het streven is om voor iedere wedstrijd NBB-scheidsrechters te regelen. Mocht dit niet lukken dan dienen niet-spelende teams, volgens het wedstrijdschema, spelers aan te dragen om scheidsrechter te zijn bij andere wedstrijden. Zij dienen op het aangegeven tijdstip aanwezig en klaar te zijn.
13. De teams dienen shirts met nummers te dragen. Zo nodig dient de ploeg die als tweede op het wedstrijdschema wordt genoemd voor reserveshirts te zorgen.
14. Er wordt gespeeld met officieel goedgekeurde wedstrijdballen. De wedstrijdballen worden verstrekt door de basketbalcommissie. De oefenballen dienen zelf meegenomen te worden.
15. Een speler met vier persoonlijke fouten wordt voor de verdere duur van de wedstrijd uitgesloten.
16. Bij twee technische fouten of één onsportieve fout wordt de speler voor de verdere duur van de wedstrijd uitgesloten.
17. Bij een diskwalificerende fout wordt de speler voor de verdere duur van het toernooi uitgesloten.
18. De ploegfoutenregel geldt tot aan de finale vanaf de achtste fout die wordt gemaakt door één team. Vanaf de achtste ploegfout, wordt iedere verdedigende fout bestraft met één punt en balbezit voor het aanvallende team.

19. In de finale geldt de ploegfoutenregel vanaf de vijfde fout per helft (15 minuten). Vanaf de vijfde ploegfout, wordt iedere fout bestraft met twee vrije worpen.

20. In de finale worden persoonlijke fouten bestraft volgens [FIBA-reglement](#). Een speler met vier persoonlijke fouten wordt voor de verdere duur van de wedstrijd uitgesloten.

21. Tijdens het spel worden fouten niet bestraft met vrije worpen, maar op de volgende manier:

- Fout tegen een niet-schietende speler: balbezit;

- Fout tegen een schietende speler die niet scoort: 1 punt en balbezit;

- Fout tegen een schietende speler die scoort: score + 1 punt bonus;

- Technische fout: 1 punt en balbezit;

- Onsportieve en diskwalificerende fouten (laten we zorgen dat het nooit zover komt): 2 punten en balbezit.

22. Protesten worden niet geaccepteerd voor zover deze scheidsrechterlijke beslissingen betreffen.

Slotbepalingen

23. Spelers dienen gepaste schoenen te dragen.

24. De organisatie draagt geen verantwoordelijkheid voor ongevallen of schade aan derden vóór, tijdens of na de wedstrijd. Deelname geschiedt op eigen risico.

25. De organisatie draagt geen verantwoordelijkheid voor diefstal vóór, tijdens of na de competitie.

26. Voor zover in bovenstaande punten geen uitzondering wordt gemaakt, zijn de [reglementen van FIBA](#) van kracht.

27. In alle gevallen behoudt de basketbalcommissie zich het recht voor om een bindende beslissing te nemen.

Regulations Basketball

GNSK 2024

Team composition and eligibility

1. Each Student Sport Council (OSSO) or city can register a maximum of two men's and two women's teams. A team consists of a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 12 players. The first team registered per OSSO or city always has the right to participate. Depending on the number of registered teams, a decision will be made regarding the participation of the second team. If there are too many second teams for the remaining spots, participation will be based on the order of registration.

2. The registered participants from an OSSO or city may only consist of students who meet the requirements as set in Chapter 1 of the SSN event regulations. In case of a violation of this rule, the

team will forfeit all matches. If an ineligible participant takes part in the GNSK, a fine of €200 will be charged to the OSSO or representative organization in the city to which the participant belongs.

3. The team lineup must be provided to the basketball committee before the start of each match. If an OSSO or city sends two participating teams, players cannot be swapped or participate in the other team. If this happens, Article 2 applies.

4. The winner of the basketball tournament at GNSK 2024 qualifies for the European Universities Championships (EUC) from July 6 to July 13, 2025, in Bologna (Italy).

Match provisions

5. The preliminary rounds of the team tournament consist of groups. The group placement is determined by drawing, with teams seeded according to Implementation Regulation Seeding GNSK 2024 and, if possible, teams from the same OSSO or city distributed across different groups. The basketball committee decides, prior to the draw, how many teams per group qualify for the final bracket, which is played through a knockout system.

6. In case of a won match, a team receives 2 points, and in case of a draw, 1 point. The final ranking in the group is determined by the total number of points a team has earned. In the event of a tie in the group stage, the ranking is decided successively by the head-to-head result and the point difference. If no decision is reached, five different players from each team take one free throw each. If necessary, both teams will then take turns with free throws until a decision is reached.

7. The duration of a match is set at 25 minutes of continuous playing time without changing sides and without a break, with the last 3 minutes being pure playing time. The final consists of two periods of 15 minutes of pure playing time, with a 5-minute break between the halves.

8. Each team is allowed one timeout per match, lasting a maximum of 1 minute, with the playing time continuing. If this timeout occurs during the pure playing time (during the last three minutes of a match or during the entire final), the clock does stop.

9. Players can be substituted without any restrictions, but only during a dead-ball moment (after the referee's whistle).

10. In the group stage, a draw is possible. If a match ends in a tie in the later stages of the tournament, an extension of 5 minutes of pure playing time will be played. If there is still no winner, five different players from each team take one free throw each. If necessary, both teams will then take turns with free throws until a decision is reached.

11. Teams must be present and ready to play at the time indicated in the schedule. If a team is not present at the specified time, the team loses the match. The score will be recorded as 20-0 in favor of the present team.

12. The aim is to arrange NBB referees for each match. If this is not possible, non-playing teams, as per the schedule, are required to provide players to act as referees for other matches. They must be present and ready at the specified time.

13. The teams must wear shirts with numbers. If necessary, the team mentioned second on the match schedule is responsible for providing reserve shirts.

14. Officially approved match balls will be used. The match balls will be provided by the basketball committee. Practice balls should be brought by the teams themselves.

15. A player with four personal fouls is excluded for the remainder of the game.
16. A player is excluded for the remainder of the game after two technical fouls or one unsportsmanlike foul.
17. A player is excluded for the remainder of the tournament after a disqualifying foul.
18. The team foul rule applies until the final starting from the eighth foul committed by one team. From the eighth team foul, each defensive foul is penalized with one point and possession of the ball for the attacking team.
19. In the final, the team foul rule applies from the fifth foul per half (15 minutes). From the fifth team foul, each foul is penalized with two free throws.
20. In the final, personal fouls are penalized according to [FIBA-regulations](#). A player with four personal fouls is excluded for the remaining duration of the game.
21. During the game, fouls are not penalized with free throws but in the following manner:
 - Foul against a non-shooting player: possession of the ball;
 - Foul against a shooting player who does not score: 1 point and possession of the ball;
 - Foul against a shooting player who scores: score + 1 point bonus;
 - Technical foul: 1 point and possession of the ball;
 - Unsportsmanlike and disqualifying fouls (let's make sure it never gets that far): 2 points and possession of the ball.
22. Protests will not be accepted as far as they concern referee decisions.

Closing provisions

23. Players must wear appropriate shoes.
24. The organization is not responsible for accidents or damage to third parties before, during, or after the match. Participation is at your own risk.
25. The organization is not responsible for theft before, during, or after the competition.
26. In the absence of exceptions in the above points, the [regulations of FIBA](#) are in force.
27. In all cases, the basketball committee reserves the right to make a binding decision.
